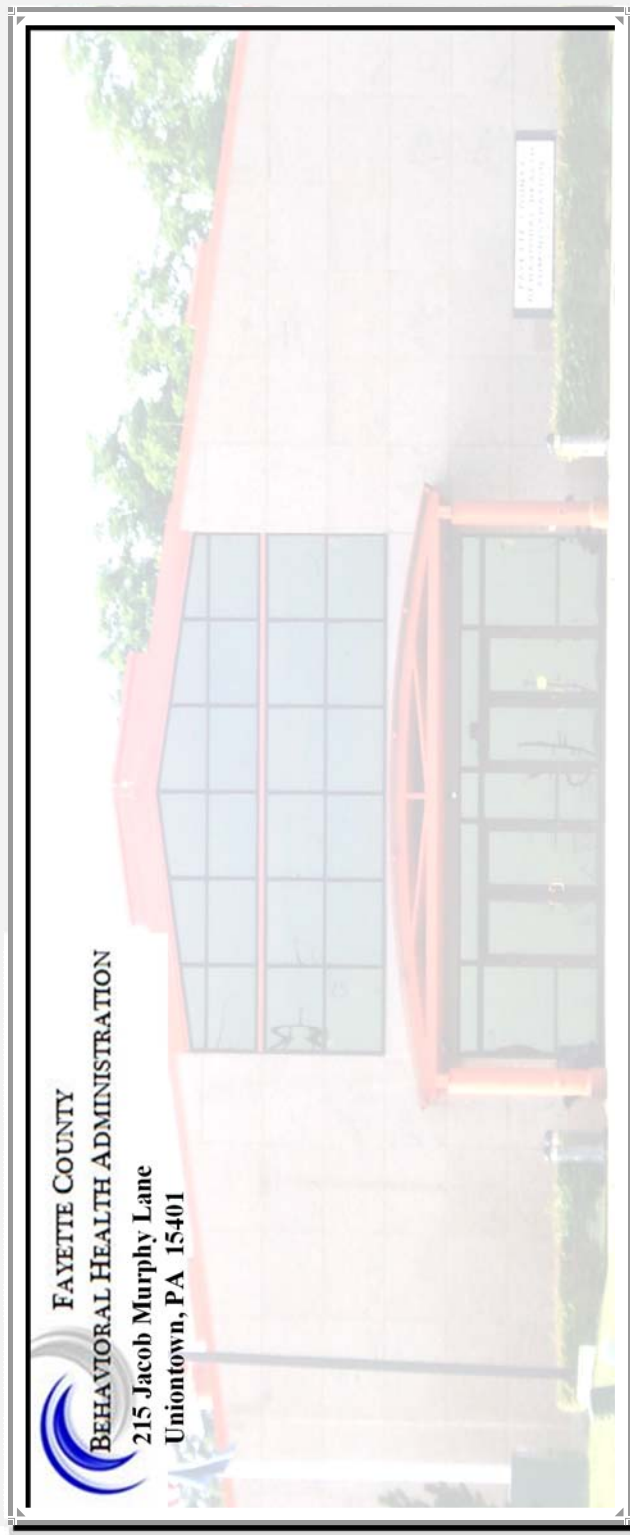

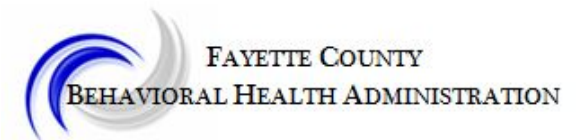

SERVICES AND SUPPORTS FOR CHILDREN IN FAYETTE COUNTY

Outpatient Psychiatric Services—Counseling services provided in an office setting including psychiatric evaluation and medication management.

Inpatient Hospitalization—Inpatient service that provides 24-hour psychiatric care in a hospital. There are several psychiatric hospitals that serve children within 50 miles of Fayette County.

Early Intervention—Services to meet the needs of infants and toddlers diagnosed with developmental delays.

Blended Case Management and Supports Coordination—Provides case management to work with children and families to find local services like counseling, medical services, recreation programs, tutoring, housing, and more. Supports Coordinators assist children with intellectual disabilities much the same way.

Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services (BHRS) - A service to help children and adolescents with serious emotional or behavioral problems to be more successful at home, in school, and community settings.

Child Care Information Services—Assists in finding and funding child care for working parents and those in training programs. For more information, call (800) 443-0888.

Community Residential Rehabilitation/Host Home—Provides host parents, a therapist, additional support services, and case management. The Host Family must meet specific standards and attend many hours of training. Most important is the commitment and partnership to provide a safe and therapeutic home for high-risk youth.

Family-Based Mental Health Services—Family therapy services provided in the child's home by a team of professionals trained in family therapy. The team works with everyone in the family to improve family relationships and helps them take advantage of other resources in their community. This can also help the child and family deal with problems at school.

High Fidelity Wraparound—A team approach that builds on the strengths of the family and their supports. The Team brainstorms ideas with families to develop plans around *their* needs. Call (724) 430-4907.

Mental Health Residential Services—Sometimes children or adolescents need some time away from home to benefit from treatment. Options include residential treatment facilities and diversion / stabilization programs. Parents remain actively involved in the planning and delivery of treatment services for their child and the child's return home.

Multi-Systemic Therapy (MST) - MST works with youth ages 10-18 and their family address behaviors like aggression, truancy, substance abuse, or ongoing conflict at home or school.

Partial Hospitalization—Day program that includes mental health treatment under the direction of a psychiatrist as well as an educational program. This can help children avoid hospitalization or out-of-home placement.

Parent Child Interactive Therapy (PCIT) - PCIT children age 2 to 7 who struggle with disruptive and/or difficult behavior including verbal or physical aggression, defiance, noncompliance, temper tantrums, or ADHD symptoms. PCIT is proven to enhance parent-child relationships.

Parent Involved Network (PIN) - an advocacy program that provides information to parents about mental health, special education or community services for children. Call (724) 438-6738.

School-Based Student Assistance Program (SAP) and Outpatient Services—Identifies "at risk" youth and provides resources and referrals to other community agencies. Some schools have a therapist on site.

OTHER RELATED SERVICES

Fayette County Community Action Agency—Provides services including case management, food bank, WIC, housing programs, education and employment assistance. Call (724) 437-6050.

Nurse-Family Partnership—Social, emotional and health-related supports to eligible women during their first pregnancy and after the birth of the child. For more information, call (724) 437-6050 ext. 208.

Fayette County Drug and Alcohol Commission—can help individuals examine their substance use patterns and develop a recovery plan for their future. Call (724) 438-3576.

Local School Districts—Your local school district has a variety of programs to assist children and teens. Call the guidance office in your district.
